SUN SHUTTLE SCHEDULE CHANGES EFFECTIVE FEBRUARY 13 **New schedule brochures available**

TUCSON, Ariz. – New Sun Shuttle schedules are now available online at www.suntran.com, offering passengers detailed route and schedule information effective February 13 through August 11, 2012. Sun Shuttle brochures will be available on the vehicles starting Tuesday, February 7, as well as at various locations around the region, such as public libraries and shopping malls starting Friday, February 11.

Specific routes and scheduling changes include:

Green Valley and Sahuarita

- **Route 421** schedules have been adjusted to improve on-time performance.

Oro Valley

- **Dial-a-Ride** service has expanded in Oro Valley to include service areas specific for the general public, senior and qualified disabled passengers. Reservations are required one to seven days in advance and fares vary depending on the service area.

Sun Shuttle is the region's neighborhood transit service funded by the Regional Transportation Authority, serving Marana, Oro Valley, Catalina, Sahuarita, Green Valley, San Xavier and Tucson Estates.

The Regional Transportation Authority is the fiscal manager of the \$2.1 billion plan approved by Pima County voters on May 16, 2006. The RTA Board is comprised of representatives from the local jurisdictions in Pima County, including the cities of Tucson and South Tucson, Pima County, the towns of Marana, Oro Valley and Sahuarita, the Pascua Yaqui Tribe and the Tohono O'odham Nation.
